#### COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS

Following ia a to-date listing of Committee Chairpersons. The importance of this subject cannot be over emphasized as committees must be regarded as the skeleton upon which the work of the Society is built.

Because of our dual responsibilities respecting both the Homestead and the Boulton property, it was deemed best, in some instances, to form Committees with a chairperson for each property while in others a single committee can serve both.

It is hoped that many members will be attracted to one category or another and participate in the program of their choice. "Working members" are the life blood of any organization and the Jacobsburg Historical Society is no exception.

Membership, Volunteers and Publications Committees are still in need of chairpersons. We know there are those among our members who have expertise in these areas. Chairpersons shall select their own committee members, trying not to engage persons already in another group and, when possible, to enlist members who are NOT Board members.

## FINANCE: John J. Schlamp

Keep financial accounts of monies received, investment of funds, payment of bills and preparation of budget.

## MEMBERSHIP:

Keep record of paid and unpaid dues along with list of members "in good standing". Solicit new members and develop with the Publicity Committee appropriate literature, etc., to serve this purpose.

## PROGRAM: Mary Ann Vincent Van Norman

Preparation of a yearly program of special events and working with Publicity and Volunteer Committees to produce such programs.

#### PUBLICITY: Dallam Blandy

Committee deals with all matters bringing the program of the Society before the public. This work involves printed material and news releases to newspapers and other media.

MAINTENANCE: Earl Van Norman (Boulton - Bill Atherton)
(Homestead - Jim Shedlauskas)

The physical plant shall come under this Committee's care, including building maintenance, upkeep of utilities and general grounds care.

GARDENS AND LANDSCAPE: Bobbi DiGerlando
John Morrow

This Committee shall establish long range landscape plans for both properties, submitted for Board approval. Responsible for care of trees, shrubs and garden plantings. Weedings, etc., shall be done by work parties.

HOUSE COMMITTEE: HOMESTEAD - Kathryn Schlamp BOULTON: - Nancy Houck

These Committees shall be in charge of the furnishings and their placement within their respective houses. Includes responsibility for the care and use of the artifacts. Dusting, cleaning to be done by volunteer work parties.

## **VOLUNTEERS:**

Build a list of persons willing to offer services. List made available to Committee needing workers. So important is the success of this Committee to the welfare of the Society that all assistance should be given to this group when possible.

GUNNERY: Bob Newell

Covers all aspects of firearms, the gun collection and things pertaining thereto.

RESEARCH: Jim Wright

This program should embrace Henry Family history as well as local history as it relates to our interpretive needs.

PUBLICATIONS: Charles Sandwick, Sr., Emeritus

Ongoing publishing program of books of historical value bringing the Boulton-Jacobsburg Saga before the public.

THE RECORD: Bea Schlamp

Responsible for preparing for the printer all material submitted by Officers, Directors and Members. The RECORD is published six (6) times per year.

# OFFICE MANAGER: Virginia Lopresti

In charge of files, office equipment, mail received (for direction to proper person). Storage of historical material, including complete file of The Record or other Society publications.

#### SPEAKERS BUREAU

Program Chairmen are always looking for speakers. This gives organizations such as ours a great opportunity for publicity. In the past a few of our members who have special interests have prepared talks to present when called upon. It would be to our advantage to have more people able to speak before their own clubs or offer their services to others when an opportunity presents itself.

In order to make it easier for those of us who may not be accustomed to presenting programs, we plan to prepare talks on various subjects which can be borrowed by members for this purpose. The subjects will vary, such as: The Homestead and Its Furnishings; The John Jacob Henry House; Outstanding Members of the Henry Family; The Natural Surroundings of the Property, and so forth. The idea would be to have topics suitable for any occasion.

These talks would be written out and, in most cases, be accompanied by a carrousel of slides relating to the subject. The slides would be numbered and their order of showing indicated in the printed talk. In this way a speaker need not be too knowledgeable on the subject to make a good presentation. Thus, members could be of service to other organizations as well as our own Society.

At present time we have a few "specialists" who are speaking from time to time, particularly Virginia Lopresti on Archaeology, and Bob Newell on Henry guns. Our desire is to broaden our subject matter and increase our number of speakers, thus reaching an expanded audience. Teachers, Den Mothers, Garden Club members and those persons belonging to other Civic or Social organizations are all potential speakers. Having the use of prepared material and illustrations at hand should make it easy for us to develop an active "Speakers Bureau".

Notice will be given when these talks are available and how they may be obtained. Are there other topics you think should be included?
