MORE ABOUT TREES ---- Report from Dale Prinkey, Environmental Education Center

An English Elm, "Vlmus campestres", planted by the Henry family in the Boulton area in the 1820's will be designated as a Pennsylvania champion tree by the Pennsylvania Forestry Association. The elm, which is on the walkway between the Homestead and the John Joseph Henry House, is one of seven that were reportedly given to the Henry family by John Jacob Astor of the American Fur Company. According to a book entitled Pennsylvania Trees, it was an old English custom to plant seven trees of the same species in a group.

The champion elm has a circumference of 14'4", is 116 feet high, has an average spread of 88 feet, and appears to be vigorous. There is a possibility that the tree may also become a champion on the National Register of Big Trees. We'll keep you posted.
