SATISFACTION: JOBS WELL DONE!

Think for a moment on following a project from start to finish. A jumble of papers, a cluttered office, a discouraging pile of material on a desk slowly become useful files in their proper drawers, a clean desk top to work on, a pleasant room where work becomes a pleasant occupation.

Picture an area below the Summer Kitchen -- dark, dank and smelling of rotting wood and damp debris. Some time later the old brick floor is swept clean, all the trash has been removed, and the air is definitely fresher, with light coming through a washed window. When new shelves and storage containers are put in place, the unattractive basement room becomes, again, a Root Cellar, showing visitors food preservation before refrigerators.

Imagine the barn door off its track, and missing boards permitting unauthorized entrance. At one corner of the foundation stones have fallen out, creating a large hole all the way through the wall. On the south side of the building loose boards dangle from a sliding door track, while at ground level another fragment of door admits unwanted visitors. What a sense of satisfaction is achieved to see, several weeks later, the new barn door sliding on its rollers, the "man door" once more usable. The stone foundation is repointed, and takes on a beauty of its own. Other functioning doors secure the lower level, and loose boards are now nailed in place. Inside one sees the piles of stored items interspersed with pure trash sorted and placed in orderly fashion, the useless material taken away. Once again the Homestead Barn is usable as a dry, secure storage area for wagons, farm equipment and items not yet on display, but safe until needed.

To see the results of these projects is gratifying, but can in no way match the pleasure of being involved in the entire program. Only the workers get the full effect of the "before and after" situation, see the changes as they develop and fully appreciate the good that has been done. In addition, only the volunteers can look back on the fellowship that the job engendered - the pride of achievement.


